Goosebumps™

Starter Level

This level is suitable for beginner-level students who have been learning English for less than a year. It precedes the Common European Framework level A1. Suitable for users of CLICK magazine.

SYNOPSIS

Zach and his mum have just moved to the sleepy town of Madison, in Delaware, USA. Zach soon meets Hannah, the girl next door, who is friendly, but her dad doesn't want her and Zach to be friends.

One evening, when Zach hears a scream from Hannah's house, he calls new friend, Champ, and they investigate. The house is scary, and they find a room full of *Goosebumps* books. It turns out that Hannah's dad is the *Goosebumps* writer, R. L. Stine.

Hannah tries to stop the boys opening a book and, to their surprise, a huge Yeti comes out of the book and appears in front of them. Hannah's dad eventually catches the Yeti by opening the book in front of it. The Yeti is pulled back into the book.

Back at the house, another monster has escaped – this time it's the evil dummy, Slappy. Slappy lets all the monsters out of their books to cause trouble in Madison.

Zach suggests writing a new story about the monsters. The plan is to pull all the monsters into the story and save Madison. R.L. Stine's typewriter is at Madison High School so they all head to the school. The monsters invade the school and terrify the students.

Zach helps Stine finish the story and catches all the monsters. They've done it! Or have they? The story ends with the sound of Slappy writing on Stine's typewriter ...

THE BACK STORY

R. L. Stine began writing at the age of nine after he found an old typewriter in the attic. He says he wasn't a sociable boy and hated playing outdoors. His first job was writing a funny magazine for children called *Banana*, which was published by Scholastic. When the magazine closed after ten years, a Scholastic editor asked him to write a horror story for young teenagers. The first *Goosebumps* story was published in 1992, and Stine went on to write 125 stories in total.

Deciding which of the *Goosebumps* stories to make into a film was tough. Then the scriptwriters decided to use a number of the *Goosebumps* characters in one story, with Slappy as the leader of the monster gang. Slappy is R. L. Stine's favourite baddie, who has appeared in twelve books, three TV programmes, three video games and now one film.

DVD: The *Goosebumps* film stars Jack Black as R. L. Stine. Black plays Stine as a mean man who hates teenagers, but learns to appreciate them during the film.

HOW TO USE YOUR SCHOLASTIC READER

Choosing and motivating

Is this the right story for your class? Have your students heard of the *Goosebumps* stories? Have they seen the film? Read aloud the first page of the story with dramatic atmosphere.

Organising

Plan a class reading schedule. Decide how many pages to set for reading each week. Select exercises from the Self-Study section at the back of the reader and extra activities from this resource sheet to go with each chunk of reading. (All answers are on page 4 of this resource sheet.)

Using the CD

Ask students to listen to the recording and read at the same time. Some of the action takes place in speech bubbles, so students need to see the images to follow the action.

Using the DVD

Select the English language option on the DVD. The running time is 103 minutes. Select key scenes to show in parallel with the class reading schedule. Note that the Scholastic reader is a much simplified version of the film.

Glossary

Go to 'New Words' at the back of the reader. Translate the words with the class or ask students to find meanings at home. The Vocabulary Builder on page 3 of this resource sheet practises the new words in a different context.

Casual language

There are a number of informal expressions used in this story. (See Vocabulary Builder on page 3 of this resource sheet.) Put them into context for students and ask students to look out for them as they read.

Fact File

Ideas on how to exploit the Fact File for whole class work are given on page 4 of this resource. The Fact File focuses on four types of monster: the Yeti, zombies, werewolves and vampires.

What did they think?

Ask students to do a written or spoken review of *Goosebumps*. Compare opinions. Would they like to read one of the original novels, either in English or in their own language? Did you like it? Let us know at elt@scholastic.co.uk.



FACT FILE FOLLOW-UP

MONSTERS! (pages 26–7)

Monster party

Brainstorm types of monster and places where they live. Write them on the board. Explain that each student is a monster at a monster party, but they mustn't tell anyone who they are. Each student chooses a monster and prepares one or two sentences to introduce themselves at the party. Help them with vocabulary. Students work in pairs or mingle as a group. They take turns to say their sentences and their classmates guess what kind of monster they are. *Example:*

Student A: I live in cold places. I have ice cream for breakfast.

Student B: You're the Yeti.

Interview with R. L. Stine

Prepare cards for students with the following information:

Ask: *Who writes the Goosebumps stories? (R. L. Stine).*

Ask students to work in pairs. Give each student card A or B. Students write questions to find out the missing information. They then interview each other and complete the information.

CREATIVE WRITING

(Activity adapted from rlstine.com/for-teachers/.)

- Stand in one place for ten minutes. What can you see/hear/feel? Write it down.
- Choose a special event that's coming up, like a birthday party, a football match or a sleepover. Before the event: imagine you are at the event. What's it like? Write a description. After the event: Write a new description. What is it actually like? Compare the two descriptions.
- Choose one hour of your life. What happens in that one hour? Write about it.

DVD/CD FOLLOW-UP

DVD: Choosing scenes

The film *Goosebumps* contains more characters and events than are included in this Starter level graded reader. Watch the film yourself and choose a few key scenes. Students vote for the scenes they would most like to watch.

Plan some observation questions based on the extract. Tell the class to watch the scene closely and pay attention to the details. Ask students your questions. Watch the extract again to check answers.

CD: What's happening?

Select a key moment on the CD from a chapter that students have already read. Play the section to students. Ask: *Who is speaking? Where are they? What's happening? How do they feel?*
