<p>All the king’s soldiers and all the king’s men couldn’t put Humpty together again.</p>	<p>Luckily, at that same time, a group of the king’s soldiers saw Humpty fall and rushed over to help him. They didn’t know how to fix his broken bones and so they phoned for an ambulance.</p> <p>After a few days in hospital, Humpty was feeling better. Nevertheless, Humpty decided that he was going to keep his feet firmly on the ground when exploring in the future!</p>
