## **DISCUSSION RESOURCES**

It has been a long time since Alice has felt safe. Because of him. Ross. But now she, Mum and her little brother Henry have finally moved far away, where Ross will never find them. It's a fresh start, Mum says. This time, she is never going back.

Slowly Alice starts to build a life for herself, at a new school with new friends. But she can't escape the feeling she is being watched. That he might be lurking, waiting to ruin everything again. That Mum might be about to break her promise. That, just when Alice is starting to feel safe, everything will be taken away from her.

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- I. "Birds are strong, but they're fragile too. Like you." This is Alfie's description of Alice. Do you agree with this statement?
- 2. "Smells always make me remember." Discuss the use of smells in the opening chapter.
- 3. Each chapter starts with Alice reflecting on her family's life with her step dad Ross. How did you feel when you were reading these flash backs?
- 4. Describe Alice's mum in three words.
- 5. If you had read *Lost* by Eve Ainsworth, you would have read about Alfie's story. How has Alfie's character developed in *Magpie*?
- 6. How does Alice feel about non-school uniform day?
- 7. Why does Alice get angry at Ben? What do you think about their friendship?
- 8. Finally, if you have all finished reading the book, did you correctly guess who was following Alice? How did the ending make you feel?

Write a one-page story from the perspective of Henry, Alice's younger brother, about his impressions of their new house.
